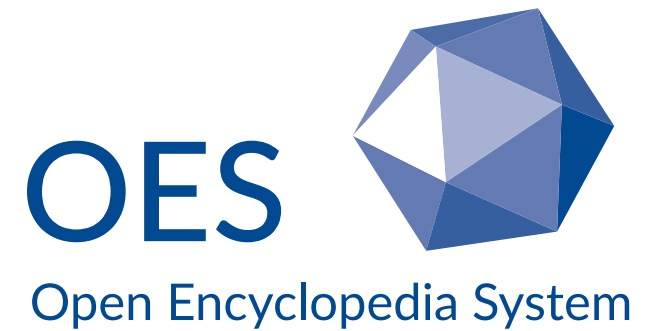

THE PROJECT

The main objective of the project “Open Encyclopedia System (OES)” is to develop a standardized web-based open source platform for building and maintaining academic online encyclopedias in the humanities and social sciences. OES is based on the experience in developing the concepts and workflows for the successful project „1914-1918-online. International Encyclopedia of the First World War“, thus starting from a high baseline.

Software



- Web-based

Modules



OES will be built with a set of modules that are adaptable to specific application contexts. Each module will be (de-)selectable and composed by configurable components:



Publication



The publication of online encyclopedias will feature:

- Individual workflows for editors, authors, referees and translators
- Online and offline submission
- Integration of e-mail and word processing programs
- Support for article versioning
- DOI (Digital Object Identifier)
- Creation of PDF and eBook files

Community engagement



OES will offer functionalities for the engagement of research communities:

- Integrated Call for Papers
- Blog functionalities
- Comments
- Reading lists
- Social media integration
- Bookmarks and annotations

Interconnection



- Internal and cross-project APIs
- Integration and support for Zotero
- Links to library catalogues
- Linked Open Data standards
- Interfaces for data import/export

Availability



- Digital preservation
- Long-term availability of online encyclopedias
